HIS Excellency the Governor has directed it to be notified, in reference to the notice which was published in the Government Gazette of the first February last, relative to the applications for debentures on account of outstanding claims, that a great delay having taken place on the part of the holders of the bills for outstanding claims, in transmitting them to the Colonial Treasury for examination, it has been found impossible to complete the necessary preparations for the issue of the debentures by the sixteenth instant. The issue of these debentures will therefore be delayed until the first of June next, on which day the interest due upon the different bills, up to the 16th April, 1844, will be paid, and debentures in exchange for their bills will be given, to all persons who shall have made application at the Treasury, in the required form, at least one fortnight previous to the first day of June next.
